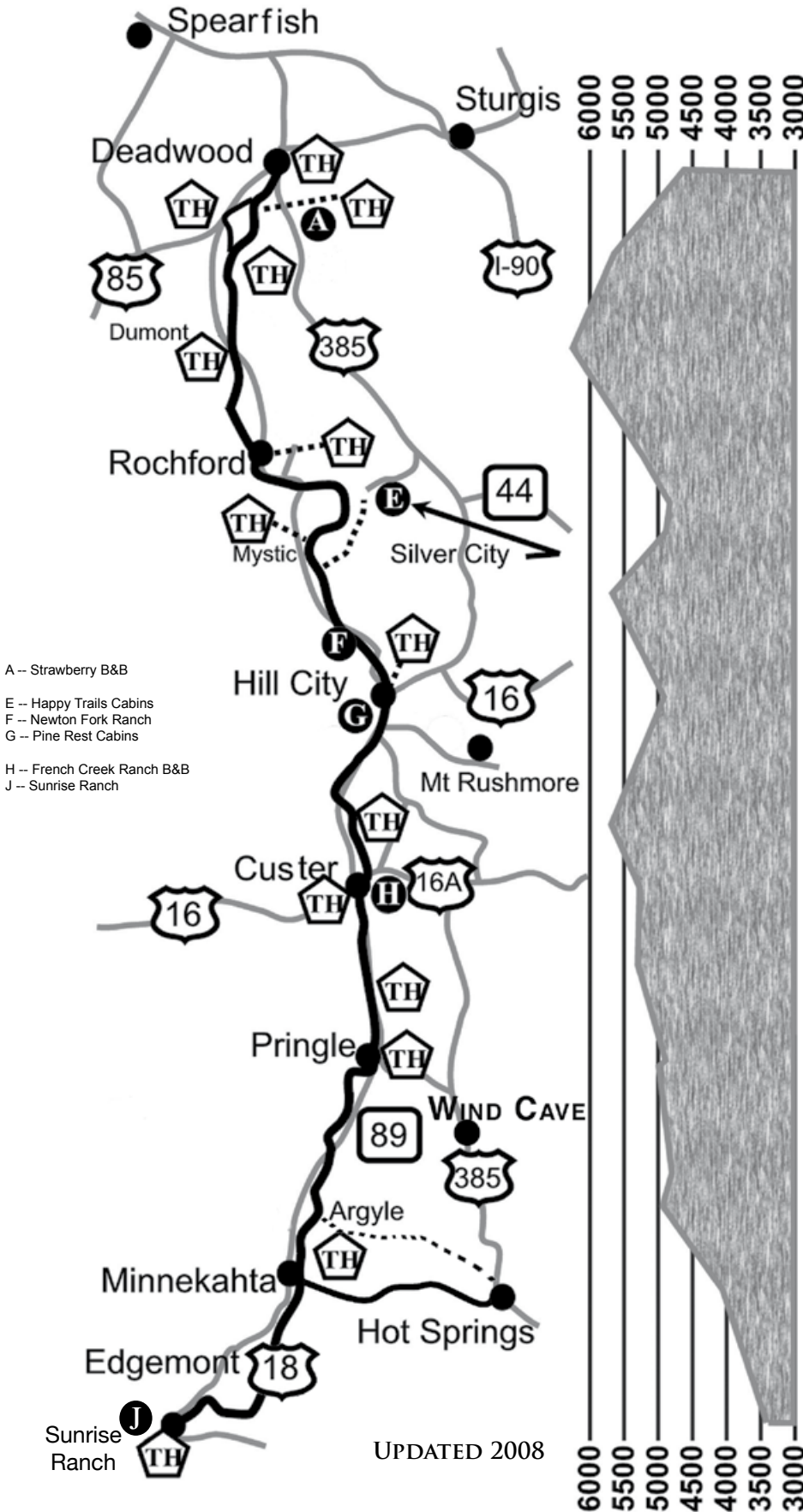

Homestake Mining Company provided the base for cultural and recreational opportunities and produced ore for one hundred twenty-five years earning the designation as America's longest continuously operated gold mine. Today, Lead recalls its mining heritage through visitor tours, community celebrations and the Black Hills mining Museum dedicated to the town's rich and storied past.

Called the Elk Capital of SD at an altitude of ~4700'. The town was originally sitting on the Deadwood—Sydney, NE. Stage route and called Rocks. In the 1890's, the RR came into the country and the town name was changed to Pringle, after a lady who ran a café for the Railroad. At one point Pringle had a high school, bank, baseball team, polo team, 3 groceries and 4 sawmills all active. During the 1930's, the CCC workers came into the area, many of them staying. It is dependent today on logging, mining, & ranching industries and supports a population of ~100.

The trailhead and the Mile Post Zero Monument are located in the city park on Edgemont's main street. Edgemont's population is 900, making it a small, friendly community. Edgemont began when the Burlington and Missouri Railroad built a line from Omaha to connect with a line from Oregon and Washington. Depot and railroad yards were built in 1890, and Edgemont became a town. The Edgemont Chamber of Commerce and Black Hills Volkssport Association are sponsors of an annual volksmarsh on the trail each May.
